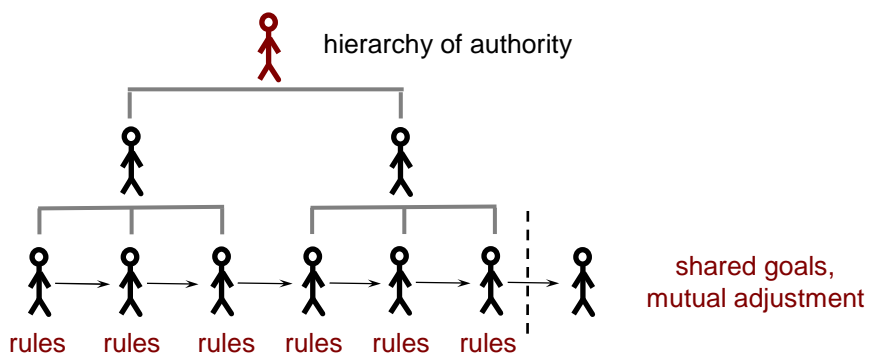

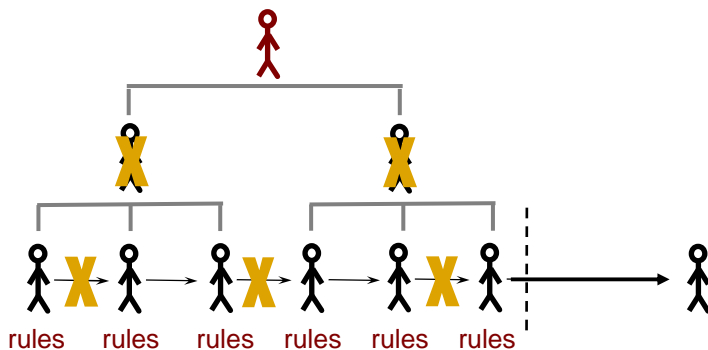

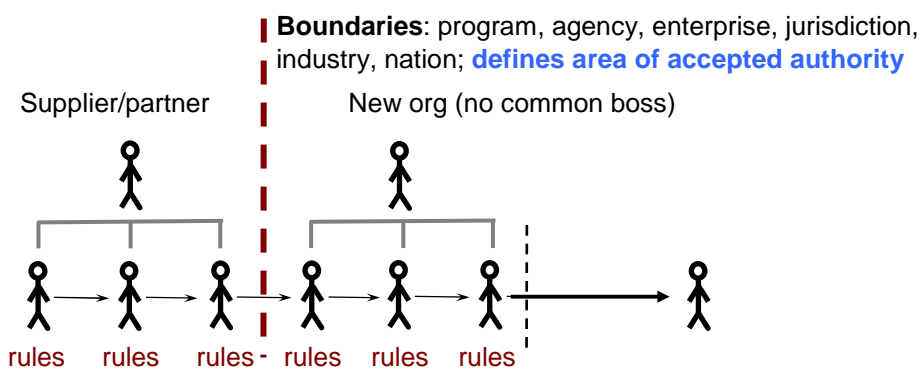
Specialized divisions of labor: **productive, fair, legitimate?**

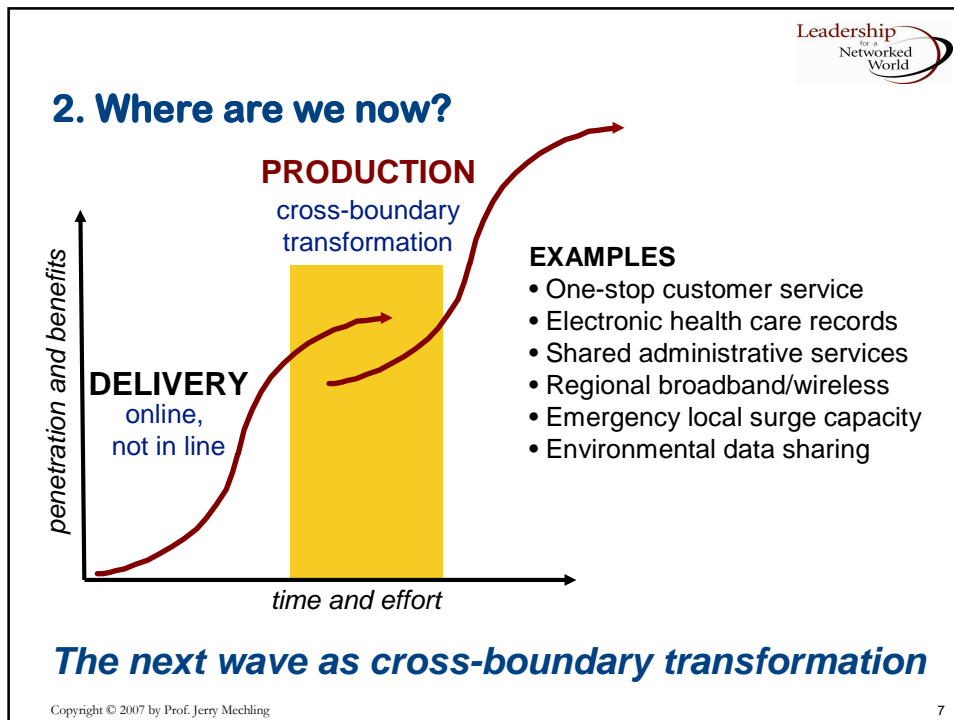
- 1. Remote, asynchronous service: **delivery reform** (hard)

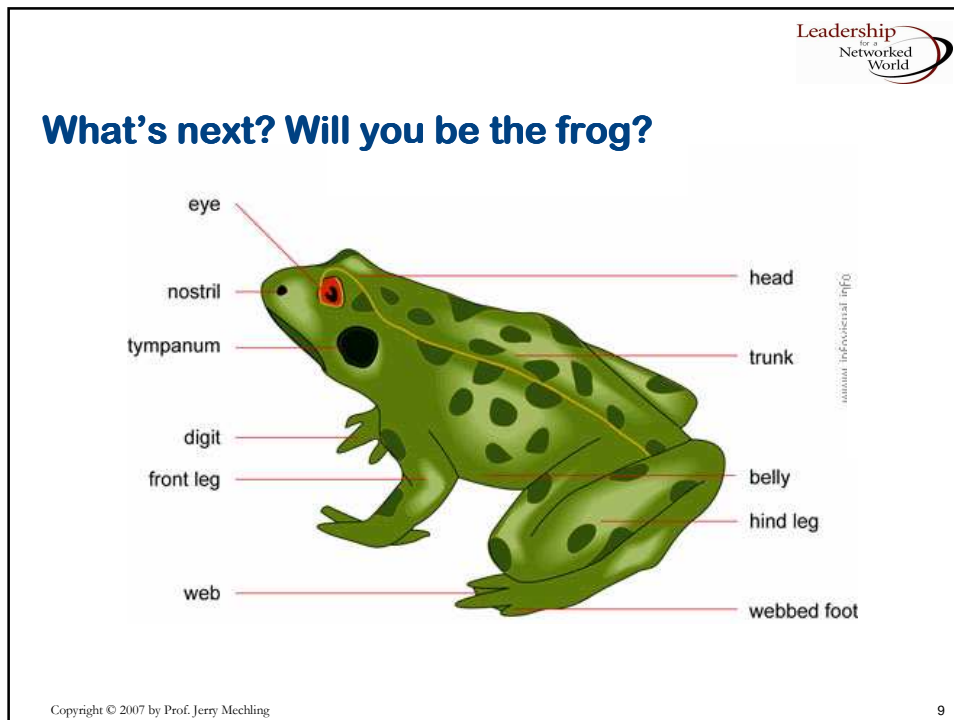

3. What's next? The very brief fundamentals...

1. **DON'T** think this is primarily a technology problem.
2. **DO** rise to the need for **active, partner-oriented, adaptive leadership**
 - **Active:** ignoring reality is not a strategy
 - **Partner-oriented:** government is neither the primary solution nor the primary problem
 - **Adaptive:** learning and innovation are the key tasks
